WELCOME

from Simon Cox, TBA NH Committee Chairman

National Hunt breeders are a resilient breed; how often has that expression been rolled out? The time between planning a mating and witnessing the resultant foal reaching the course can see many changes to not only the physical but also its pedigree page. There is also the matter of several unraced stock waiting in the wings, which can create a cash flow vacuum.

The TBA and its National Hunt Committee endeavour to improve the economic situation through various means, which includes taking ownership of and championing the Great British Bonus and the Elite Mares' Scheme (EMS). The Levy Board generously doubled the available fund for the EMS which has allowed us to redesign the scheme and further support and encourage mare owners to visit high-quality British NH-based stallions. We are also able to provide greater reductions to nomination costs for British domiciled mares, and in many cases the nomination is now free. In tough economic times this can only help (full details on page 24).

Breeding is a virtuous circle and a strong broodmare band, which Britain has developed through changes to the mares' programme and incentives, will help to strengthen its stallion ranks, which will then assist in strengthening the product which is trained by British trainers. This will drive and create demand for the British-bred product.



Whilst breeding any winner is an achievement to be celebrated, success at the biggest festivals is the aspiration for many. Looking at Cheltenham last March, there was much to cheer from the successes achieved by Golden Ace, Poniros and The New Lion in Grade 1 contests. These successes are what fuels the belief that the foal born each spring is going to become a champion. It was good to welcome many breeders to this year's awards which took place in May to celebrate many other notable successes and stories. The event was once again supported by Goffs for the 11th year. My thanks to them and all the sponsors of the event which I would encourage you all to attend next year.

The TBA Board composition has seen a greater influx of NH breeders recently and we have had some great new additions

to the NH committee as well. I'd like to personally recognise all the efforts of the board and committee members, we recognise that we have a host of significant challenges in our NH sector, but I am confident that we have the right people assembled to tackle these challenges on your behalf.

A constant flow of new entrants is required to continue to drive forward British breeding, and this is one of the focuses for the Board in 2026. NH stallion studs will be playing their part in January, opening their doors over the open house weekend on 10/11 January, which will provide access to areas that might previously have thought to have been off-limits. Much like being on the racecourse is a different experience to one watching on the television, getting in front of a stallion and viewing him is different to viewing a photo in a brochure.

SILVER CELEBRATIONS FOR HIGHFLYER

'Happy birthday to you, happy birthday to you, happy birthday dear Highflyer Bloodstock, happy birthday to you!'

Still going strong and compiling a substantial list of major-league racehorse purchases, the Newmarket-based agency is about to celebrate 25 years of buying winners, a landmark that says as much about the bond between its employees as it does of customer relations. Some clients, Nicky Henderson springs to mind, had been loyally using Minton and Bromley's services for some years since before they set off on their

own in 2001, aided in the background by office manager Bernice Emanuel. The trio remain in situ having been joined, 20 years ago, by a third agent, Tessa Greatrex.

Yet the roots of the agency and its Million In Mind racehorse partnership operation, cannot be found in Newmarket or any other racing centre, but in rural Shropshire, a county that is big in sheep, but also has strong thoroughbred connections. As a teenager Minton spent a formative season with Cecil and Joan Bromley, Anthony's grandparents, at their Wood Farm Stud near Telford, and some years later, when the now-established bloodstock agent was visiting the stud, the Bromleys' grandson asked: "Can I come and work for you one day?" Minton quietly laughed the request off, but the seed of a notable double act had been planted.

Given that Wood Farm Stud was handed down to Bromley's parents Bill and Di, why did Anthony not simply continue the line? He says: "I couldn't see a UK stallion stud providing two families with incomes. I wasn't a rider - breeding and farm were my thing - and I wanted to be a racing manager and bloodstock agent. Minty knew my grandparents and had said I could join him for six months when I left school. I went for six months and never left."

Family played a role in Minton's career, too, for he says: "My grandfather, Bob Bebb, was a dairy farmer who bred Pendil (top chaser of the

1970s) and was my initial inspiration. At 16, I wrote 27 letters to every conceivable person in bloodstock and had five replies. Three were totally negative, but John Richardson, who ran Sandown Sales and had a pedigree business near Newmarket offered me a job. I joined John, went to his home at the age of 17 and started doing four-generation pedigrees by hand. There were no computers - can you imagine the books that were needed? Sandown Sales gave me an interest in the auctioneering side."

With Newmarket on his doorstep, Minton was soon expanding his contacts while gaining a cornucopia of education at studs, racing stables and at the Curragh Bloodstock Agency, where in October 1970 he became pedigree boy.

First buy was no error

Adding horse purchasing to pedigree research required more assistance and a couple of early strokes of luck. For trainer Gavin Pritchard-Gordon - who later became chief executive of the TBA - Minton sourced King Pele who went on to win the Gloucestershire Hurdle, now Supreme Novices', at Cheltenham. Yet his first purchase was even better.

Minton says: "Tom Corrie, another of my early inspirations, owned Space King who stood at Wood Farm Stud. I was going around evening stables with Tom one evening and, as we looked at this huge gelding, he said 'How old do you think this horse is?'. I said 'four or five' and he said, 'no, two - he's going to be a good horse'."



Minton had already met the legendary Worcestershire trainer Fred Rimell, who recognised the youngster's ambitions and said 'let me know if you find a nice horse'. Just over a year later, after Corrie's horse had won and been placed on the Flat, the erstwhile agent mentioned him to Rimell who duly bought the prospective hurdler for £12,000. The horse was Comedy Of Errors, who went on to win two Champion Hurdles in a vintage era.

Minton has coached, advised and assisted a who's who of bloodstock people over the years yet the one with lasting impact for his own business is Bromley. Recognising the importance of work experience, Minton found his protégé placements at Shadwell and Cheveley Park in Britain and at Lane's End in America.

Bromley says: "I learned from a great man in Minty – he's a people person, with a wonderful appetite for life and always looking on the positive side. He always believes England will win the cricket, while I'm thinking of the ways they can lose. We're quite different. I hope when I'm 75 I have the same enthusiasm."

"I went to other studs for experience, but was under Minty's wing and always came back to his fold. Working with him and Nicky at store sales for the past 35 years has been a great grounding.

"In the early days, Minty would say 'Go to Ascot Sales and meet a client who wants a point-to-pointer for his daughter', so we'd meet, have a cup of tea and spend two grand. You learn a lot that way, because it's harder to buy the right horse at that money than it is when spending 100 grand. The 100 grand horse hits you in the face.

"Minty's so personable and will talk quite naturally to everyone. The person holding the horse will always get a hello. Being polite is

a good quality, as is transparency and being very open. If you aren't telling fibs the job is much easier."

Early days for Highflyer

Upon returning from America, Bromley joined David Minton Bloodstock, although that business was subsequently bought out by the British Bloodstock Agency. Minton took a seat on the board, but before long cracks appeared as agents and shareholders – primarily Sir Stan Clarke and Sir Robert Ogden – disagreed on how the company should be run. Minton and Bromley decided to go it alone and hatched a plan to create Highflyer Bloodstock, while Joss Collins did likewise by forming Blandford Bloodstock with a youthful Tom Goff.

Given that Bromley and his wife Anna had a toddler son, Joe, and would later provide him with baby brother Ben, it was a bold move to leave the umbrella of an established and recognised agency, but Bromley says: "We had been working for a solvent business which had our backs for bad debts, so it was nerve wracking (to set up on their own), but it was the best thing we ever did.

"Minty's contract as a BBA director had to be sorted out, and David Powell, my agent in France, was worried the BBA had a good name and this could jeopardise the position. I wasn't concerned about that, reasoning that clients who knew us would soon get used to a new name."

In Highflyer's favour there were good horses coming off the production line, none better than Azertyuiop, who in the year of the agency's inception proved a smart novice hurdler and later a brilliant two-mile chaser for John Hales and Paul Nicholls.

As agent Bobby O'Ryan once said: "If there is a bloodstock sale on the dark side of the moon, I'll be there," and that willingness to seek a good horse in any location probably applies to most agents. Highflyer has supported British sales since its inception, and has always sold its annual draft of Million In Mind horses at Doncaster. Yet, in launching the new business, Bromley knew

he had to capitalise on a market in which he had an edge.

He says: "France helped to launch us, and to be fair the BBA had been a big help. In 1995 I had the idea of following Martin Pipe to France, and the BBA had funded me to go on a number of trips. There was a lot of looking at and taking photographs of horses, but I wasn't getting any business and must have looked like a tyre kicker. Then I persuaded Capt (Tim) Forster, who by that time wasn't a well man, to join me in visiting France where he bought a horse and it got others thinking it wasn't so tricky after all.

"Things suddenly started happening. Paul Nicholls took an interest as Highflyer was launching, but a lot of credit must go to David Powell, our eyes and ears in France and who had a very good reputation over there. The horses I bought there in the early years of Highflyer – horses like Kauto Star, Master Minded and Big Buck's – are still my calling card today."

Gaining on the level

Highflyer, and Bromley in particular, enjoyed a very good year in 2025 with horses purchased for the Flat. Highlights being the Windsor Castle Stakes victory of Havana Hurricane – who was bought for 9,000gns at Tattersalls' Somerville Sale – and the National Stakes win for Zavateri, a 35,000gns Book 2 buy.

Kingsgate Native, Bradsell and Trueshan were earlier, inexpensively-bought horses who showed the agency was not a one-dimensional outfit, and Bromley says: "There's a broader base of ownership in the Flat and if we can do more Flat horses, great.

"I've been lucky to buy big winners at all the big jumps meetings in France, Britain and Ireland, but there was a nice feel in getting a potential champion two-year-old (Zavateri). It was an unusual experience, but I am buying more Flat horses these days so I suppose the chances increase."

Memory lane of top horses

Really special purchases, the horses which have given Highflyer agents the most satisfaction, are stamped on their hearts.

Minton launches with, "Sprinter Sacre has to be number one. His second Champion Chase win would be the most momentous day in my

racing life." He continues: "Three Hemmings-owned National winners (Hedgehunter, Ballabriggs and Many Clouds) have to be up there, and Mysilv, who won the Triumph Hurdle in 1994 was close to my heart. I had invited cousins and uncles and aunts and my future father-in-law to join in ownership of her through Million In Mind and her success put the syndicate on the map. There have been others, too, Long Run and Bobs Worth, both Cheltenham Gold Cup winners..."

Greatrex says: "Cole Harden, who won the World Hurdle and Punchestown winner Bill Baxter, both trained by my husband, Warren, have to be up there, while Willoughby Court and The Jukebox Man are two Grade One winners I bought for Ben Pauling."

Bromley says: "Kauto Star opened all the doors, but I feel very proud of Noble Yeats. Robert Waley-Cohen wanted a horse for his son, Sam, to ride in the Grand National in his last season. I bought Noble Yeats two months before.

"On the Flat Relief Rally was really special because she was a new venture for Simon and Isaac, who had done well jumping, but wanted to do more on the Flat. She was bought for 58,000gns, won £315,000 and sold for 800,000gns – that gave me a real kick and it ignited their interest in Flat racing.

"But yes, Noble Yeats has to be the most satisfying. I absolutely nailed that."

Behind the scenes

Bernice Emanuel says: "I've been with Minty and Anthony for 29 years and I do everything that needs doing (apart from buying horses). I'm a Girl Friday, who handles the secretarial work, the accounts, I get them from A to B in terms of travel and I look after the members of Million In Mind. After 29 years I do it with my eyes closed.

"During Covid, when there was no cricket or racing on the telly, I started typing up Minty's autobiography which he sent me on pages each week. Then cricket and racing came back on the telly and it stopped dead, a pity because he has some great stories.

"Both he and Anthony are lovely to work for. It's not really like a job. For some reason they keep paying me and I'm not really sure why, because I love coming to work every day and I feel like part of a family.

"There are a lot of people in this game who can be dismissive of others, but Minty, Anthony and Tessa are warm and friendly. They don't just buy a horse and walk away; they care and want the horse to do well for the client. Anyone can buy a horse for a million and get a good one, but the

THE ELITE MARES' SCHEME: FUELING FESTIVAL SUCCESS

When You Wear It Well galloped up the hill to Cheltenham Festival success in March 2024, she exemplified what the HBLB/TBA Elite Mares' Scheme can achieve. Back in 2016, breeders Reg and Jane Makin sent the Listed-winning Flemensfirth mare Annie's Answer to Midnight Legend and through the responsibility of Jamie Snowden and his team, achieved success at British NH racing's biggest festival in the Dawn Run Mares' Novices' Hurdle.

Through the utilisation of the Elite Mares' Scheme, the Makin family were able to access a drastically reduced fee to Midnight Legend. They had previously gained reduced stallion nominations to Schiaparelli and Kayf Tara through the scheme, which resulted in the Listed chase-placed mare Schiaparannie and the Graded-placed hurdler Answer To Kayf. Their experience demonstrates the scheme's potential.

For 2026, the scheme enters a new phase. The Levy Board has doubled its funding, a move that will allow more breeders of elite mares to access reduced nomination fees to eligible British-based National Hunt stallions. This represents not merely an incremental adjustment but a statement of intent.

The rationale behind such investment is straightforward, if not simple to achieve. The foundation of any breeding operation or industry rests on the strength of its

broodmare band. Despite consistently producing high-quality horses, the likes of Constitution Hill, Honeysuckle and Sizing John, Britain's broodmare population remains at a significant numerical disadvantage to its direct competitors in Ireland and France.

To increase both the scale and quality of Britain's broodmare band, an increase in the supply of high-quality racehorses to British owners and trainers through the progeny of superior mares is required. Research demonstrates a strong correlation between a mare's racing performance and the quality of her offspring. Higher-quality mares increase the likelihood of economic returns for breeders, and the ability to attract quality stallions to stand in Britain depends on both the quality and quantity of the available broodmare pool.

These interconnected factors have shaped the design of the Elite Mares' Scheme from its inception.

The scheme's impact, achieved with relatively modest investment, has been tangible. The population of elite broodmares has undergone a remarkable transformation, climbing from 151 in 2014 to approaching 300 today. When including mares that qualified through having produced high-quality racehorses, 350 mares were eligible for the 2025 scheme. This represents a fundamental shift in the breeding landscape.

Small but significant amendments were brought in for 2025 allowing time to assess the scheme's impact and identify opportunities for greater effectiveness. The research phase has now translated into concrete enhancements for 2026.

At its core, the scheme encourages British breeders to utilise the best National Hunt stallions Britain has to offer. Mares qualify through one of two routes: either race performance (having won a black-type contest

The revised categories are as follows:

Category 1A – 150+ rated mare: **£5,000 grant**

Category 1B – producer of 160+ rated gelding or 150+ rated mare: **£5,000 grant**

Category 2A – 130-149 rated mare: **£4,000 grant**

Category 2B – producer of 140-159 rated gelding or 130-149 rated mare: **£4,000 grant**

Perhaps most significantly, the previous restriction preventing a mare from visiting a stallion whose fee exceeded double her grant has been abolished. In its place is a more flexible 'triple grant' rule, subject to a £12,000 cap. This change opens doors to stallions previously beyond reach for many scheme participants.

The 2026 amendments streamline the structure, reducing the number of categories from three to two while increasing the available grants. This means larger reductions in nomination costs for breeders, with the most substantial increases benefiting those mares previously in the now-removed Category 3.

ELITE NH MARES' INCENTIVE SCHEME

Criteria 2026

The HBLB/TBA Elite National Hunt Mares' Incentive Scheme was created to highlight to breeders the quality of National Hunt stallion standing in Great Britain. Open to TBA members who own mares rated 130+ of who have produced a runner of a defined performance level (see below) are eligible for subsidised nominations to British-based stallions which are eligible and nominated by their managers under the terms of the scheme. All mares must be domiciled in Britain.

Scheme details

Category 1a Mares that achieved a peak Official Rating of 150+	Category 2a Mares that achieved a peak Official Rating of between 130 and 149
Category 1b Mares who have produced a NH horse officially rated 150+ (mare) or 160+ (gelding) in Great Britain, Ireland or France	Category 2b Mares who have produced a NH horse officially rated 130-149 (mare) or 140-159 (gelding) in Great Britain, Ireland or France

Winners of black-type races over obstacles in Great Britain, Ireland and France will be treated as having the following minimum ratings, if these are above those awarded:

- Grade 1 WFA winners or winners of three Grade 2 races: **150** mares, **160** geldings;
- Winners of a Grade 2 WFA race: **140** mares, **150** geldings;
- Winners of a Grade 3 or a Listed WFA race: **135** mares, **145** geldings;
- Winners of a Graded/Listed Handicap: **130** mares, **140** geldings.

NB: Winner of an additional race as specified above will be treated as having achieved a rating of 5lb above that defined by the single win, i.e. 2x Grade 3 or Listed wins are treated as equivalent to a Grade 2 win. When the above measures are applied, horses relying on winning races that are confined to three-year-olds or four-year-olds will be treated as having achieved ratings 5lbs below those stated above.

The peak Official Ratings used are identifiable from the BHA and HRI websites or recorded on the Racing Post database. Mares who have run in France, other than

those who qualify through winning black-type races, shall be assessed for the scheme based on their French rating doubled, as is the way the BHA handicapper assesses.

A mare that qualifies for the scheme by satisfying multiple criteria (either as a race mare and producer, or as producer of more than one qualifying horse) will be regarded as having achieved an Official Rating increased by 10lb for every additional qualification.

No mare aged older than 22 (born in or before 2003) is eligible for the scheme.

A list of mares who according to Weatherbys records are eligible for the scheme by their own official rating can be found on the TBA website (thetba.co.uk). If your mare is not included on these lists and you believe that she should be, please contact the TBA office.

For any mares who qualify through their progeny, the onus is on the mare owner, when completing the registration form, to provide evidence that the mare is eligible for the scheme. Applications can only be accepted through the online application for on the TBA website.


Action:

- If your mare meets the scheme criteria, select a stallion for the forthcoming breeding season that is included in the scheme (see page 28 for a list of eligible stallions).
- Complete the application form on the TBA website before Saturday, 31 January 2026.
- All those applying for the scheme will be contacted after the closing date to confirm if their application has been accepted and a nomination agreement will be sent directly from the stud the stallion is standing.
- Only on receipt of a positive 1st October pregnancy certificate will the grant value be paid directly to the stallion owner. The mare owner will be responsible for any outstanding amount of the nomination fee, plus VAT, and the VAT on 75% of the grant value.

Grants

Owners of mares nominated for the scheme will receive a grant entitling them to a discount on the nomination fees of any of the stallions which are included in the scheme. The grant value is determined on the category of the mare.

Category 1a/1b: £5,000

Category 2a/2b: £4,000

These grants, which are paid direct to the stallion owner on receipt by the TBA office of a positive 1st October pregnancy certificate, apply to the 2026 breeding season only and cannot be carried forward to any future season.

If the value of the grant is the same as or greater than the advertised fee for the stallion, the mare owner is responsible for

paying VAT on 75% of the fee (this being the payment made by the HBLB to the stallion owner on redemption of the grant). If the value of the grant exceeds the advertised fee, then no refund of this excess is payable to the mare owner.

If the value of the grant is less than the advertised fee, then the grant may only be used if the advertised fee of the stallion is no greater than twice the grant value. In this case any excess fee is payable by the mare owner, who is responsible for paying VAT on 75% of the grant value (this being the payment made by the HBLB to the stallion owner on redemption of the grant), plus that on the excess fee negotiated with the stallion owner.

GOLDEN PERIOD FOR HORN UNDER BOTH CODES

Mission accomplished! Three and a half years ago Jayne McGivern bought brilliant Derby and Arc victor Golden Horn and moved him from Dalham Hall Stud to Overbury Stud, in order to maintain British breeders' access to a true dual-purpose stallion at an affordable covering fee.

In the intervening period the son of Cape Cross had been doing pretty well, but this year he did exactly what he was purchased to do, by excelling with his progeny in both disciplines.

In the National Hunt realm he was represented by Champion Hurdle heroine Golden Ace and Triumph Hurdle winner Poniro, as well as Grade 2 scorers East India Dock, Mark Of Gold and Nemean Lion, while on the Flat he was on the mark with leading stayer Trawlerman, who took the Gold Cup and British Champions Long Distance Cup, and top-class fillies and mares Divina Grace, Karmology and Santorini Star.

"It's been a good year, hasn't it?" says McGivern with a wry smile. "His Cheltenham Festival was unbelievable. He had five runners, all in Grade 1s, and they included Golden Ace and Poniro, as well as East India Dock, who was third to Poniro.

"I thought that would be difficult to beat, but then the Flat season came around and he didn't just get his first Group 1 winner with Trawlerman at Royal Ascot, but he also had all sorts of black-type winners here, there and everywhere.

"East India Dock won the Chester Cup and was Listed-placed on the Flat, too. He's a great ambassador for his sire as he shows the versatility of his progeny. Owners and trainers get a double whammy with them: they do well on the Flat and can have an extra career over jumps too, if that's their thing."

Golden Horn's oldest crop were eight-year-olds in 2025 and he has taken his time to show his worth, especially as a rich source of Flat talent, but McGivern never lost faith in the sire.

“What he did this season was what everyone was hoping he'd do when he had his first three-year-olds a few years ago, and he didn't quite do it,” concedes McGivern. “But I always thought his progeny needed a little more time and I always knew they all have one thing in common: they're all tough and they dig in. They might sometimes get headed but they don't know they're beaten. They take a couple of breaths and come back again. You see that time and time again.

“So although I'm very proud of him, I'm not surprised by what he's done. I knew it was always there, I knew he could do it. He just needed the opportunity to show it. What's nice too is that his winners this season are not all out of the best mares, the sorts he covered in the earliest years of his stallion career.

“His percentages by nearly every measure on the Flat and over jumps – winners to runners, stakes winners to runners and so on – are now as good as and, in a lot of cases, even better than more expensive horses than him.

“On top of all that, all his progeny are very beautiful. He does rather stamp them, doesn't he?”

Speaking in the autumn, McGivern says that after consulting with Overbury Stud's Simon Sweeting it is likely that Golden Horn will remain at a fee of £10,000 for the 2026 breeding season.

“Since we've had the stallion he's always been oversubscribed at the limit I've put on his book, which I'm incredibly grateful to breeders for,” she says. “It would have been easy to raise his initial fee of £8,000 at Overbury to £12,000 before now, but we've been mindful of our fellow jumps breeders and the tricky market they face.

“But on the other hand, there are other horses at a much higher fee who don't offer the same value, in my opinion, and the Flat market has started to think he looks attractively priced and he's getting more bookings from those breeders.

“We'll probably stand him at £10,000 next year. I still want him to be attractive to the

National Hunt market – and I think at that fee he is – but we also need to recognise his worth as a Flat sire.”

McGivern says that she is actively considering standing another stallion, one who is as multifaceted as Golden Horn. But if and when she buys one, it will be on her own terms.

“I looked very seriously at two this year,” she reveals. “I get offered legs and shares all the time, and occasionally take one. I've taken one in Kameko, for example. But doing it like that isn't really my thing. I prefer to buy one on my own, as I did with Golden Horn. When I bought him I could have easily syndicated him to any number of people, and kept a shareholding at no cost to myself, but then I wouldn't have been able to say I didn't want him to cover more than 180 mares in a season.

“We've been asked to lease Golden Horn to Japan a couple of times, but that's not for me either. I don't think it's in his best interests. That's not a criticism of other people who would do it, but I know him, his personality and what's best for him. I might not have been able to refuse the offers if I had other shareholders to consider.

“Call me a control freak but if I bought another stallion I'd want to be a majority shareholder at least, or, failing that, be a partner with someone like Simon, who thinks along the same lines. But on the whole I'd rather just buy one myself.

“I like to make my own mistakes, that's all. That's why, when I play tennis, I only play singles. If I play doubles and my partner is responsible for losing the game, I can't stand it. I like to screw up on my own, then I've only got myself to blame.”

It was also a landmark year for the breeding side of McGivern's Dash Grange Stud, her operation in the Cotswolds that houses a small and select brand of National Hunt and Flat broodmares, which she started in earnest only a few years ago.

“When I look at the accounts, all I see is a big fat loss, so I can't say we're very commercial at the moment,” she says. “But, on the other hand,

my first homebred, Kissmehoneyhoney, a filly by Crystal Ocean out of Buildmebuttercup, won on debut this year, and won really well too. I was chuffed, as the project is really only just starting. I have a 100 per cent record as a breeder at the moment, so maybe I should retire now!

"Kissmehoneyhoney is quite a big filly, a doppelganger of her mother, and she's not without talent. William Haggas, who trains her, has been brilliant. He didn't rush her, he said he'd let her grow up and strengthen and she'd tell him when she's ready. Still, though, we were only really hoping that she'd run on into mid division on her first start, so for her to win was amazing.

"She'll have some time off, so she can strengthen and grow a bit more, and she'll come back for some early races at four in 2026. She'll have no trouble staying. She's exactly what I'm

trying to breed: a classy middle-distance horse. She'll be a brilliant match for Golden Horn one day. She might actually prove my breeding strategy works!"

McGivern's first homebreds produced specifically for National Hunt are also coming of age. Dash Grange Stud sold at the Goffs UK Spring Store Sale in May 2025 a Nathaniel half-brother to Grade 2-winning hurdler Jetara out of a Milan full-sister to Jezki to Paul Nicholls for £75,000 and a Jukebox Jury half-brother to smart handicap chaser Bhaloo to Olly Murphy for £34,000, while among those being retained to race is the Blue Bresil full-sister to Constitution Hill who turns three in 2026.

"I always thought I'd sell the colts and geldings and keep the fillies, but since deciding that I've

had a lot of fillies," says McGivern. "We sold the geldings we did have in Doncaster in May. We thought we'd stay on home turf while still learning the ropes. The two who sold went to very good trainers, so I was delighted.

"I thought the other gelding we entered for the sale, by Jack Hobbs out of Perfect Grace, made a bit of a noise in the lead-up to the auction, so we withdrew him. But he's really grown up and matured since, and has stopped making the noise. I think he must have had a bit of a wobbly oesophagus or something. So we decided to run him ourselves instead. Nigel Twiston-Davies has him, and says he likes him, so the hope is he'll win and then we can sell him in training. He hasn't had a wind op so he should be fine for that.

"We sold a few fillies too, though. We sent two to the Flat yearling sales. We would have kept them, but we have to push some money through the accounts to keep the VAT man happy.

"That said, one of them, a Lope De Vega filly out of Wisdom Mind, didn't sell at 80,000gns so we brought her home. She was offered five lots from the end of Book 2 and I think everyone must have been in the bar or spent all their money. She was nice, maybe a smidgen backwards, but we thought she was worth a little more than that and so we'll put her in training and maybe offer her for sale again if she runs well.

"It might actually have been a stroke of luck because Wisdom Mind's two-year-old daughter Regal Resolve won a Listed race at the back-end of the season. It's great the mare has black type now. She has a Baaeed filly foal who we'll also race."

McGivern has spent plenty of money in setting up her boutique breeding operation. Golden Horn must have cost a pretty penny, while Constitution Hill's dam Queen Of The Stage was bought for £340,000, multiple Grade 2-winning hurdler and chaser Concertista was purchased for €220,000, useful hurdler Buildmebuttercup was sourced for €165,000 and the well-bred Jelan cost €85,000. There have also been several expensive Flat acquisitions, including Wisdom Mind for 460,000gns.

So is Dash Grange Stud paying its way?

"The plan was for the stud to wash its face by the end of year five," says McGivern. "We're now at the end of year three and we're not there yet, but we've had a bit of bad luck. We have a nice mare by Blue Bresil out of Petticoat Tails who was the top lot at the Goffs UK Spring Store Sale a few years ago. She went to Nicky Hederson and should be running now, as I like them to race before breeding from them, but she got cast and fractured a sesamoid, so she's now in foal to Golden Horn too.

"But I hope that in two years' time the stud breaks even and perhaps even makes a small profit, so that it starts to repay the capital expenditure we made in setting it up."

Receipts from Golden Horn's coverings at Overbury Stud should help balance the books, especially after his annus mirabilis on the track.

"It really was a smashing year – a turnaround year," says McGivern. "He's redeemed himself, and he's incredibly good value for what he's done. I hope people realise that."

TELEPATHIQUE

For GBB, the 2024/2025 season was unquestionably defined by one mare, Telepathique.

Bred by Mrs Elizabeth Gordon Lennox, the Telescope mare was offered at the Goffs January Sale in 2019 but was 'Not Sold' at just £4,500. What might have seemed a disappointment turned out to be fortuitous luck. Retained by Mrs Gordon Lennox to race herself, Telepathique would go on to earn £100,000 in GBB bonuses.

Her racing campaign has been nothing short of masterful, taking full advantage of every incentive available – no surprise to anyone familiar with trainer Lucy Wadham's skill with multiple bonus winners. Wadham's past success with Martello Sky, who amassed over £50,000 before the £50,000 fillies' limit for non-GB-based stallions, set the stage for Telepathique's path to success.

Ridden by Bryony Frost, Telepathique claimed her first bonus in a Warwick bumper in February 2023, earning £10,000. A swift move to hurdles followed, yielding a £20,000 bonus in a maiden at Southwell that November.

By the winter of 2024, Telepathique had turned her attention to what would become her specialty, chasing. She won a non-GBB chase at Fakenham on 30th October, then returned to Warwick on 20 November to claim a £10,000 bonus in a novices' handicap.

January 2025 brought the launch of GBBPlus, a game-changer for chasing mares. The new scheme removed sex restrictions meaning mares' only and all-sex chases

would carry equal bonus values and added class 3 and 4 handicap chases. Most crucially for Telepathique, every chase was now worth £30,000 in GBB bonuses.

With £40,000 already secured, and another £60,000 to play for, Telepathique began 2025 with a phenomenal victory at Fakenham in a class 2 handicap chase. Leading from the start, she crossed the line unchallenged by nine and a half lengths, earning one of the first £30,000 bonuses under the new scheme.

Her next outing came in the Listed Lady Protectress Mares' Chase, where she saw off competition from Brides Hill, a Listed and Grade 2 winner, by three and three-quarter lengths, securing her second and final £30,000 bonus.

In just ten starts, Telepathique won six times, placed second twice, and achieved an official rating of 148, qualifying her for the TBA's Elite Mares' Scheme. She has so far amassed over £88,000 in prize money and £100,000 in GBB bonuses – a remarkable return for a mare who once failed to sell for £5,000.
